The Codington County Commissioners met in regular session at 9:00 a.m., Tuesday, January 5, 2021, at the Codington County Courthouse. Commission members present were: Lee Gabel, Charlie Waterman, Myron Johnson, Troy VanDusen and Brenda Hanten; Chair, Brenda Hanten, presiding. Commissioner Waterman lead the pledge of allegiance.

CALLS FOR PUBLIC COMMENT AND CONFLICT OF INTEREST ITEMS

Chair Hanten called for public comments to be taken up during the open portion of the meeting; none were offered. There were no conflict-of-interest items to note.

OATHS OF OFFICE

Commissioners, Waterman and VanDusen, and Coroner, Terry Sorensen, took their oaths of office.

AGENDA APPROVED

Motion by VanDusen, second by Waterman, to approve the January 5, 2021 agenda as posted; all voted aye; motion carried.

MINUTES APPROVED

Motion by Johnson, second by VanDusen, to approve the minutes of December 29, 2020; all voted aye; motion carried.

2020 OLD BUSINESS

Chair Hanten called for old business from 2020; none was forthcoming.

BOARD ADJOURNS SINE-DIE FOR 2020

Motion by VanDusen, second by Johnson, to adjourn sine-die for 2020; all voted aye; motion carried.

NOMINATIONS FOR 2021 CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR

Auditor, Cindy Brugman, called for nominations for Chair for 2021. Commissioner VanDusen nominated Commissioner Hanten. There were no other nominations forthcoming. Motion by Gabel, second by VanDusen, to cease nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Commissioner Hanten; all voted aye; motion carried. The Auditor then called for nominations for Vice-Chair. Commissioner Hanten nominated Commissioner Gabel, Commissioner Waterman nominated Commissioner Johnson, there were no further nominations offered. The Auditor distributed uniform blank slips of paper to the Board for a private vote based on the two nominations. The Auditor tallied the votes and announced three votes for Commissioner Gabel, and two votes for Commissioner Johnson. Motion by Waterman, second by VanDusen, to accept the ballots as cast and Commissioner Gabel was declared the Vice-Chair for 2021.

MONTHLY REPORTS

Veterans Service Officer, Todd Rose, updated the Board: approximately 20 Veterans have been contacted to determine eligibility for a V.A. pension; the Watertown CBOC continues to see patients by appointment and have now started processing V.A. ID cards if the Veteran is from the local area; the Veteran's computer is up and running in the Veteran's Service Office; the Veteran's Service Officer has completed TRIP training and is now accredited by the V.A.; the employee review for Peggy Raml, office

secretary, as been completed; the wage/compensation surveys for the office have been completed; there were 5 Veteran transports in the month of December; and future projects include exploring a new phone/communications system, attending local Veteran's meetings, review of past claims, further dissemination of information regarding V.A. benefits, and reaching out to local organizations requesting donations or support for a new DAV transport vehicle. **4-H/Youth Program Advisor, Jodi Loehrer**, updated the Board: Shooting Sports is scheduled to begin on January 12th with a plan submitted to SDSU for approval, Farm Show plans are proceeding and have also been submitted for approval to SDSU for the calf show and the lunch counter; work continues to finalize a Farm Credit grant to assist with paying for electrical upgrades in the barn area; the 4-H leaders will meet in January. Ms. Loehrer is participating in a book read networking project with peers from North Dakota and Kansas utilizing a publication titled "The Marketing Rebellion."

COUNTY COMMISSIONER 2021 WAGE

Motion by Johnson, second by Gabel, to increase the Commissioners salaries, 1.75% over the 2020 rate of \$1,887.45, the same increase provided to all County employees in 2021, resulting in a salary of \$1,920.48 per month for 2021; all voted aye; motion carried. Motion by VanDusen, second by Gabel, to approve an additional \$100.00 per month for the Chair; all voted aye; motion carried.

CORONER COMPENSATION

The Board discussed the current rate of compensation for the Coroner. Motion by Johnson to compensate the Coroner at the current rate of \$175.00 per case and mileage. Newly elected Coroner, Terry Sorensen, was present for this discussion and provided the Board with information on how he will proceed with the duties of the Coroner's office including following the legal procedure for chain of command for the handling of decedents. Discussion was also held regarding the 2021 budget for this office.

Commissioner Johnson's motion failed for lack of a second. Motion by Gabel, second by VanDusen, to compensate the Coroner at a rate of \$200.00 per case plus mileage at the current state rate of \$.42 per mile; all voted aye; motion carried.

CRIMINAL SUPPORT COORDINATOR

Chief Correctional Officer, Matt Blackwelder, requested authorization to hire a Criminal Support Coordinator for the Detention Center to fill a vacancy. Motion by VanDusen, second by Johnson, to approve the hiring of a Criminal Support Coordinator for the Detention Center; all voted aye; motion carried.

CORRECTIONAL OFFICER POSITION

Chief Correctional Officer, Matt Blackwelder, requested authorization to hire a full time Correctional Officer for the Detention Center to fill a vacancy. Motion by Gabel, second by Waterman, to approve the hiring of a full-time Correctional Officer for the Detention Center; all voted aye; motion carried.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT UNION CONTRACT

Motion by Gabel, second by Waterman, to approve the Highway Union Contract, including the following changes: \$200 clothing allowance per covered employee to be paid in January of each year, updating of the language in Section 15.1 regarding compensation time for the Highway Dept. when the Courthouse is closed and the Highway Dept. must work – no change in how it was administered but merely an update to correct language, contract term changed to 2 years with the exception of wages which will be re-opened and negotiated annually for COLA, and updating of Appendix B – wage scale for a 1.75% increase for pay 2021; all voted aye; motion carried.

GIS WEBSITE DEVELOPMENT AND HOSTING

If said taxes, penalty, interest, filing fee, insurance, publishing costs along with all other fees and costs required for the reconveyance are not paid to the Treasurer by the deadline indicated above, this Resolution shall become null and void and the property shall remain in the name of Codington County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Codington County Commission, that consistent with the terms of this Resolution, the Codington County Commission hereby authorizes reconveyance of the above-described property and further authorizes the Treasurer of Codington County to execute a Quit Claim Deed transferring the interest of Codington County, South Dakota, back to the record owner of said

property, Chad A. Stavig. This Resolution shall be published in the regular minutes of the Commission meeting and said reconveyance shall be made only after the time for appealing from this Resolution has expired.

**RESOLUTION 2021-2
CODINGTON COUNTY WEIGHT LIMIT RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, seasonal climatic changes can be detrimental to our highways, and

WHEREAS, the Codington County Board of Commissioners desires to protect existing Codington County Highways, ultimately saving tax dollars and,

WHEREAS, the Codington County Board of Commissioners desire the enforcement of weight limitations on Codington County Highways as set forth and posted by the Codington County Highway Superintendent.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

WHEREAS, the limits on Codington County roads shall be, forty miles per hour truck speed limit, and maximum load limit shall be seven tons per axle on all asphalt surfaced roads during the Spring thaw period from February 15th, 2021 to May 1st, 2021 inclusive, when limit signs are in place. That the South Dakota Highway Patrol be, and hereby is authorized and requested to enforce weight and speed limitations on Codington County Roads.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the penalty for the violation of the load restrictions shall be as set forth in SDCL 32-22-55.
