The Codington County Commissioners met in regular session at 9:00 a.m., Tuesday, August 24, 2021, at the Codington County Court House. Commission members present were: Lee Gabel, Charlie Waterman, Myron Johnson, Troy VanDusen, and Brenda Hanten; Chair Hanten presiding. Commissioner Waterman led the pledge of allegiance.

CALLS FOR PUBLIC COMMENT AND CONFLICT OF INTEREST ITEMS

Chair Hanten called for public comments to be taken up during the open portion of the meeting; none were offered. There were no conflict-of-interest items to note.

AGENDA APPROVED

Motion by VanDusen, second by Gabel, to approve the August 24, 2021 agenda as posted; all voted aye; motion carried.

MINUTES APPROVED

Motion by Johnson, second by VanDusen, to approve the minutes of the August 17, 2021 meeting of the Codington County Commissioners; all voted aye; motion carried.

FIRST READING OF ORDINANCES #75, #76, & #77 REGARDING MEDICAL CANNABIS

Zoning Officer, Luke Muller, gave the first reading of the following ordinances: Ordinance #75, an ordinance entitled, an ordinance to amend article II, definitions; section 3.05.01, "permitted uses" (C – commercial district); section 3.06.01 "permitted uses" (I – industrial district); and article V "supplemental regulations"; adopted by Ordinance #65, as amended of the zoning ordinance of Codington County. Ordinance #76, an ordinance entitled, an ordinance to amend article II, definitions adopted by Ordinance 61, as amended, of the joint zoning ordinance for Codington County and the City of Watertown. Ordinance #77, an ordinance establishing licensing provisions for cannabis establishments to the revised ordinances of Codington County. The 2nd reading, public hearing, and action to adopt these ordinances will take place on Tuesday, September 7, 2021, 5:30 p.m., at Watertown City Hall during a joint meeting of the Codington County Commissioners and Watertown City Council.

MONTHLY REPORTS

Commissioner Gabel presented the Board with the following statistics, compiled for the month of July 2021, for the Detention Center and Sheriff's Office: 728 cases/calls for service; 22 accident reports completed; 90 warrants served; 168 sets of civil papers served; 5,072 transport miles; average daily inmate population 76.84 (high of 86 and low of 69); 16 individuals wearing SCRAM (security continuous remote alcohol monitor) bracelets; 41 individuals testing daily for PBT'S; 58 individuals reporting twice weekly for UA Drug testing; 3 individuals using sweat patches; 214 bookings; \$7,374.49 collected in fees for out of county prisoner contracts; \$1,700.00 collected in work release fees; \$8,030.00 collected in fees for the 24/7 program; and \$2,884.00 collected for SCRAM fees.

COUNTY SURPLUS EQUIPMENT SALE

The Board noted a County surplus equipment sale will be held on September 25th at the Codington County Extension Center Complex. The City of Watertown will also sell surplus items at this sale.

WELFARE GUIDELINES UPDATED

Welfare Director, Sara Foust, presented the Board with updates to the Poor Relief Guidelines for Codington County. Motion by Johnson, second by Waterman, to approve the updated guidelines as presented by the Welfare Director; all voted aye; motion carried. A copy of the guidelines will be posted the Welfare Director's section on the County's website.

COUNTY ROADS ELEVATION REPORT

Highway Supt., Rick Hartley, provided the Board with a report of current water elevations on County Road's 10-1 (170th St.), 8-1 (167th St.), and 23-4 (442nd Ave). The Highway Supt. advised the Board that sections of all three roads will need to be raised to preserve access to homes in the area. Mr. Hartley noted that in talks with the SD DENR draining is not an option in these areas. County road 23-4 is a priority at this time.

ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT PURCHASE FOR HIGHWAY DEPT.

Motion by Gabel, second by VanDusen, to approve the purchase of an iPad or other such electronic equipment for the Highway Dept., as requested by the Highway Supt.; all voted aye; motion carried. The primary purpose of this purchase is to track inventory of various items at the Highway Dept.

HB1259 (SDCL 31-34) RURAL ACCESS INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM

Highway Supt., Rick Hartley, advised the Board that a meeting will be held on Monday, August 30th, at 6:00 PM, at the Codington County Extension Center Complex, regarding the Rural Access Infrastructure Program created by the SD Legislature in 2021. This program will provide grant funding for the inventory of small structures on Township roads and County secondary roads and the development of plans for improvements to said small structures. The purpose of this meeting is to inform Township officials of the process/requirements to qualify for funding for the program. A quorum of Commissioners may be present for this meeting.

This email is in regards to the 2019 Highway Infrastructure Program Fund Allocation that dispersed funds directly to LPA's to be used to perform maintenance, rehabilitate, or replace structures in poor condition. With the original agreement was a list of structures (named "Attachment A") that were in poor condition at the time the funds were dispersed. Moving forward, when you submit your yearly report due January 31 each year, please make note of any structure not originally on Attachment A to get verification from DOT it was in poor condition.

We have also extended the expiration date to use these funds until December 31, 2025. This will give LPA's ample time to put these funds to where they are needed most. A yearly report will still be required with the last one due by January 31, 2026.

In order to extend the expiration date for the noted 2019 Highway Infrastructure Program Fund Allocation Agreement, we are asking that you sign and return the attached amendment.

AMENDMENT NUMBER 1 AGREEMENT NUMBER 716876

BACKGROUND:

- 1. On 07/25/2019, the State of South Dakota, acting by and through its Department of Transportation, referred to in this Amendment as the "STATE," and Codington County, referred to in this Amendment as the COUNTY, entered into a Funding Agreement, which is referred to in this Amendment as "AGREEMENT," and which was signed by representatives of each party and assigned agreement number 716876 by the STATE.
- Since the execution of the AGREEMENT, other bridges in addition to those listed in Exhibit A to the AGREEMENT have been classified in poor condition. The parties wish to amend the AGREEMENT to allow these additional bridges to qualify for funding.

THE PARTIES MUTUALLY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The AGREEMENT is amended to authorize expenditures for replacement or rehabilitation of bridges that do not appear on Exhibit A to the AGREEMENT, provided that the STATE'S Office of Administration has confirmed to the COUNTY, in writing, that the subject bridges are classified in poor condition.
- 2. Paragraphs 4. and 5. of the AGREEMENT are amended to read as follows:
 - 1. The COUNTY will submit project estimates for the bridges to be funded under this Agreement and file an annual report with the STATE on the progress of the bridge work and expenditures. The COUNTY will send annual reports by January 31st of each year to the Bridge Inspection Engineer, South Dakota Department of Transportation, Office of Administration, 700 East Broadway Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota 57501. The COUNTY will send the annual reports until all projects funded under this AGREEMENT have been completed and fully reported to the STATE.
 - 2. If any funding transferred to the COUNTY under this Agreement is not expended by the COUNTY by December 31, 2025, the COUNTY will return the unused funding to the STATE by February 28, 2026. The annual report due on January 31, 2026, shall identify any unexpended funds.
- Except as specifically modified by this Amendment, all terms and conditions of the AGREEMENT will remain in full force and effect.
- 4. The COUNTY has designated its County Commission Chairperson as the COUNTY'S authorized representative and has empowered the Chairperson with the authority to sign this Amendment on behalf of the COUNTY. A copy of the COUNTY'S Commission minutes or resolution authorizing the execution of this Amendment by the Chairperson as the COUNTY'S authorized representative is attached to this Amendment as Exhibit 1.

This Amendment is binding upon the signatories not as individuals, but solely in their capacities as officials of their respective organizations and acknowledges proper action of the STATE and the COUNTY to enter into the same.
