Commission members present were: Lee Gabel, Charlie Waterman, Myron Johnson, Troy VanDusen and Brenda Hanten (via teleconference); Chair Hanten presiding. J.T. Fey, Watertown Public Opinion, led the pledge of allegiance.

# CALLS FOR PUBLIC COMMENT AND CONFLICT OF INTEREST ITEMS

Chair Hanten called for public comments to be taken up during the open portion of the meeting; none were offered. There were no conflict-of-interest items to note.

# **MONTHLY REPORTS**

Auditor, Cindy Brugman, reported the Auditor's office is working on preparing pay 2022 tax levies, has submitted the 2022 annual budget to the SD Dept. of Revenue, and is waiting on final legislative census re-districting information. Welfare Director, Sara Foust, reported fewer people coming through the Welfare Office in September but needs remain high with more people who are homeless and the emergency apartment has been utilized almost every day; CARES/ERA hours for August were 101.5 - \$5,075.00 and 110 hours – 5,500.00 for September, with a total of 172 first round applications processed; ICAP – 34.4 hours in August. The Welfare Director attended a Summit on Building a Crisis Response Continuation in our Communities; attended the annual SDACWO conference and accepted a position on the executive board for that association; is working on a Helpline Center Network of Care through a Bush Foundation grant received by the 211 Helpline Center; is working on a \$50,000 grant through the SD DOH to hire a Community Health Worker; continues to investigate office space to meet future needs; and has met with A&B Business Solutions to gain information on scanning software for paper office records. The Welfare Director will attend an Interagency Meeting; a Resilient Communities stakeholder meeting; and is working on a Social Services strategic planning process.
