The Codington County Commissioners met in regular session at 9:00 a.m., Tuesday, December 13, 2022, at the Codington County Court House. Commission members present were: Lee Gabel, Charlie Waterman, Myron Johnson, Troy VanDusen and Brenda Hanten; Chair Hanten, presiding. The pledge of allegiance was led by Legislators Hugh Bartels and Byron Callies.

#### CALLS FOR PUBLIC COMMENT AND CONFLICT OF INTEREST ITEMS

Chair Hanten called for public comments to be taken up during the open portion of the meeting; none were offered. There were no conflict-of-interest items to note.

#### AGENDA APPROVED

Motion by VanDusen, second by Gabel, to approve the December 20, 2022 agenda as posted; all voted aye; motion carried.

#### **MINUTES APPROVED**

Motion by Johnson, second by Waterman, to approve the minutes of December 6, 2022; all voted aye; motion carried.

#### MONTHLY REPORTS

Veteran Service Officer, Todd Rose, updated the Board: 2 transports were conducted in November, one has been conducted this month with another transport scheduled for December 22<sup>nd</sup>; consideration is being given to moving the Veterans' Service office to the space previously occupied by the Welfare Office in the City Auditorium; a new National Parks lifetime pass is available for military Veterans and Gold Star families; Toys for Tots were collected by the office this Christmas season; a version of a metric spreadsheet to present data to the Board may be ready with January data when the Veterans' Service Officer presents his monthly report in February 2023; Jay Robert's full-time status will begin on 1/1/2023; the lift in the City Auditorium has yet to be repaired; and local veteran organizations will be reminded of the Bridge Naming Program and applications which need to be filed by April 1, 2023 or sooner. Director of Equalization, Shawna Constant, updated the Board: the office is busy updating ownership on recent property sales before tax bills are generated for pay 2023; re-appraisal values continue to be updated; assessment adjustments continue to be processed; the appraisal staff continue to work on building permits; and the Dept. of Revenue is currently on-site conducting the annual sales audit. Welfare Director, Sara Foust, presented the Board with a report of services, CARES/ERA fees reimbursed, ICAP hours, Office activities, Systems of Care/Strategic Planning - Interagency meeting, Community Transformation, Mental Health, Centralized Services & Community education, Childcare working group, and Housing working group. The Welfare Director noted SDHDA has approved a 1.2 million dollar grant to establish emergency, non-congregate, housing in Watertown. A new non-profit, Watertown Cares, has been established for this emergency housing program, with a five-member Board, including representatives from the City, County, School District, and non-profits, who are in the process of finalizing policies and procedures for the organization. Highway Supt., Rick Hartley, updated the Board: recent weather conditions have greatly affected projects at the Highway Dept., gravel hauling and rip rapping has come to an end; snow/ice build-up has occurred on County Roads due to the weather conditions the week of December 12th, sanding is taking place where needed; the new mower tractor ordered in January of 2022 arrived at the Highway Dept. on December 13th; trees still need to be hauled

from Memorial Park to the County pit for burning; and staff are working on inventory as time permits. Facilities Manager, Steve Molengraaf, updated the Board: Extension Center Complex – events are slowing down this month but are scheduled to pick up again in January; and the barn is being prepared for the Farm Show. Government Buildings – new entry rugs have been laid; carpet cleaning is taking place through-out the building; and ground floors have been stripped and re-waxed. Detention Center: the boilers have been repaired and are working at this time; small black drainage pipes are being repaired/replaced with plastic pipes; and RFP's have been sent to several firms for the HVAC project. Memorial Park – the lease agreement with the Girl Scouts will be terminated after the Chair signs the lease termination paperwork later in this meeting and Camp Spot is increasing their online/offline fees for bookings. Weed Dept. – the Facilities Manager attended the year-end seminar; a Weed Board meeting was held on December 6<sup>th</sup>; and the annual soup supper & meeting will be held on February 22<sup>nd</sup>. The new phones will be set up beginning today with the new system set to port on December 28<sup>th</sup>.

#### **DISCUSSION WITH AREA LEGISLATORS**

District 5 Legislators, Lee Schoenbeck, Hugh Bartels, and Byron Callies (representative-elect); met with the Board; via ZOOM and in person; to discuss items that may come before the Legislature during the 2023 session. Topic discussed included: the Regional Jail study; a proposed bidding bill for local and state governments; election procedures; food sales tax; and SDRS investments.

Thank you for your participation in the Diversion Fiscal Incentive Program through the Juvenile Justice Reinvestment Initiative. Diversion programs are a vital part of sustaining our juvenile justice system. These programs keep our youth in their communities and assist in providing life skills and services to help youth grow.

Since FY2016 when the program began incentivizing counties to utilize diversion opportunities, the successful completion of youth offenders in diversion programs has doubled. I am pleased to say that the number of successful completers has increased from 970 during the first year of the program to 1,985 this past year.

This increase shows the commitment from counties to better serve our youth and reduce dependence on the juvenile justice system. Consequently, the number of successful completers once again surpassed the state's ability to pay counties the maximum rate of \$250/successful completer. For FY2022 submissions, counties will be paid \$209.28/successful completer. This rate resulted in the enclosed payment of \$35,577.60 for Codington County.

The Diversion Fiscal Incentive Program is a result of the strong relationships between state and local governments and community providers. Thank you for all your hard work!

Policy on Codington County processing and awarding of Rural Access and Infrastructure Funds to Townships

In compliance with SDCL § 31-34, Codington County will distribute Rural Access and Infrastructure Funds (RAIF) by awarding grants to townships using the following process:

- By the last business day of October each year, townships will submit applications for RAIF grants to the Codington County Highway Superintendent (SDCL § 31-34-4).
  - Townships will use the most current version of the "Codington County Rural Access Infrastructure Grant Application" form (either for "culvert" or "small bridge" as appropriate) for each project for which a grant is requested.
  - The application form is based on the criteria established in SDCL § 31-34-5 and township eligibility requirements in SDCL § 31-34-6 and SDCL § 31-34-7.
  - Applications must be accompanied by a resolution approved by the township board of supervisors authorizing the application and any funding commitments (SDCL § 31-34-4).
- By the last regular Board of County Commissioners meeting in November of each year, the County Highway Superintendent will
  - Verify township eligibility and perform a preliminary evaluation based on SDCL § 31-34-5, SDCL § 31-34-6 and SDCL § 31-34-7.
  - Inform the Board of County Commissioners of the applications received and their eligibility.
  - o Based on the criteria in SDCL § 31-34-5, advise the Board of County Commissioners on the priority of importance of the projects addressed by the applications.
- By the last regular Board of County Commissioners meeting on or before January 15<sup>th</sup> of each year, the Board of County Commissioners will act to award or not award RAIF grants based on the eligible applications received from townships. The decisions of the Board of County Commissioners are final and non-appealable. However, a denied application may be submitted in a subsequent year (SDCL § 31-34-4).
