WHEREAS, the South Dakota Department of Transportation Local Bridge and Improvement Grant Fund requires that in order to be eligible to apply for Bridge Improvement Grant funds, Counties are required to develop a five-year Highway and Bridge Improvement Plan, hereinafter referred to as Plan; and

WHEREAS, Codington County has utilized the South Dakota Department of Transportation, County Staff, the First District Association of Local Governments, Townships, and the general public in developing the various components of the Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Plan includes maps and lists identifying an inventory of highways and bridges, project needs, and revenue sources; and

WHEREAS, Codington County held a public meeting on September 19th, 2023 to solicit input into the Plan, and the citizens who attended expressed an interest in the Plan; and

WHEREAS, the County will be able to use the Plan as a tool to budget for transportation enhancements and better coordinate transportation issues with other entities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CODINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS THAT THE CODINGTON COUNTY FIVE-YEAR HIGHWAY AND BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT PLAN IS HEREBY ADOPTED AND IS RECOGNIZED AS THE HIGHWAY AND BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT PLAN FOR CODINGTON COUNTY.

MONTHLY REPORTS

4-H/Youth Program Advisor, Jodi Loehrer, updated the Board: it is National 4-H Week this week and they have 4-H Spirit week on the Codington County 4-H Facebook page and have received a lot of comments on there; last week attended the SDSU Extension Conference in Pierre; kids are working on their 4-H record books and award applications that are due in the office on Friday, October 6, and will be judged by the 4-H Leaders this month; 4-H Recognition Event is Sunday, October 29th, 2023 at 2:00 p.m., the new 4-H year began on October 1st, 2023 and youth are re-enrolling already, call the office if you are interested in joining 4-H, will be attending the National 4-H Conference with some colleagues, they will receive a regional Northcentral Region Award along with a few colleagues receiving awards, will be helping Progressive Ag Safety with their presentation and have 2 colleagues giving a workforce development presentation; 4-H Cloverbuds will begin in November after they know how many youth they have, last year in 2022-2023 there were 50 Cloverbuds, with 21 of them turning 8 so they will now be joining "BIG 4-H" this year. Veterans Services Office, Todd Rose, updated the board: metrics for the month, 159 open claims (working claims) (77 pending action from VA) 200 completed (YTD), currently working for 56 veterans and have completed claims for 25 veterans from outside our county; \$13,517 for the month of September 2023, increase in monthly compensation for veterans or their dependents YTD monthly increase \$96,652; \$122,466

for the month of September 2023, retro-payment to bring a claim current to monthly compensation YTD retro-payments \$1,102,860.; 1 veteran DAV transports in September and 1 transports currently scheduled for October; lettering on front door is complete, the outside sign is being made and should be up in the next week or so, continue to get a lot of nice comments about the new office, Work Study starts tomorrow, October 4, 2023; meeting with the Commanders of the County Veterans Organizations; will be on the Veterans radio program Thursday morning, KWAT at 8:40 a.m. and KXLG at 9:00 a.m.; Veterans Day Ceremony will be at the County Extension Building on Friday, November 10th, 2023 at 10:00 a.m. with South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs Secretary, Greg Whitlock, will be the guest speaker. Community Health Nurse, Codi Martin, reported the following to the Board: Personnel/office activity: currently have a position for a WIC Public Health Assistant opening, that closed on September 22nd, 2023 with interviews will be completed shortly, this position will be filling the role that was opened when Karen Jensen retired in August; Staff training: nurses and clerical were trained on new temperature monitoring devices for the fridge and freezers that currently store the vaccines, are upgrading to help streamline temperature monitoring and able to alert staff if temperatures are out of range which will be helpful when no one is at the office, also waiting on check-in training for a new system that will be used for the state employees during the flu shot clinics; Immunizations: school immunization audits have started for all schools in Codington County, many schools have sent their rosters of the children and the nurses have been busy with auditing the students' immunizations and been contacting the schools, flu vaccines have arrived in the office, people will be able to come in and get those, have scheduled 3 different clinics for state employees' and are working with the schools that they contract with that are interested to provide school-based flue shot clinics also; WIC: the numbers have continued to stay steady in WIC, the division between WIC and Public Health Nursing was completed September 1st, 2023 and continue to work within the office and completing referrals to each side to fully serve the clients, August was Breastfeeding Awareness Month, were able to gift 4 of the breastfeeding baskets to mothers that were breastfeeding fully and were breastfeeding partially, with a cooler and breastfeeding support accessories by using State and County funds for this and all the mothers were very excited with the gift; Maternal Health: they continue to order car seats which is done twice a year and need to increase the order because they continue to run low on them, set to get the next shipment in October, continue to screen families for both a safe place for an infant to sleep and car seats: Child/adolescent services: 4 out of the 5 school services are completed will complete them toward the end of October; Community Involvement: continue to attend the Interagency Meetings and the Advisory Council meeting with the County that the Welfare Office holds.

REVISED PUBLIC HEALTH ASSISTANT JOB DESCRIPTION IN THE COUNTY HEALTH NURSE OFFICE

Motion by Johnson, second by Schweer, to approve the revised Public Health Assistant job description, Human Resource Representative, Natalie Remund and Community Health Nurse, Codi Martin, informed the Board that the Public Health Assistant job description needed to be revised to add that this position may require travel to assist with services and may be asked to work evenings and Saturdays to accommodate participants' needs, due to the Federal requirements for the WIC position; all voted aye; motion carried.

FY2024 WIC CONTRACT

PURCHASE OF TREES FOR MEMORIAL PARK

Motion by Gabel, second by Schweer, to purchase 10-6-7' Black Hills Spruce trees from Sioux Valley Nursery at a cost of \$355.00 per tree including transplanting costs and 10-12'+ Black Hills Spruce trees from Dennis Molengraaf at a cost of \$752.00 per tree including transplanting costs; Facility Manager, Steve Molengraaf, informed the Board of the 4 different quotes that he had received to purchase 20 Black Hills

Spruce trees to replace the damaged trees from a storm that occurred last summer at Memorial Park and was estimated from insurance approx. \$1,000.00 per tree; the 4 quotes were from; Tree Farm for 6-7' Black Hills Spruce Trees including transplanting \$355.00, Sioux Valley Nursery for 10' Black Hills Spruce Trees including transplanting \$650.00 and won't be able to transplant them until next Spring, Keith Block for 12' Black Hills Spruce Trees including transplanting \$1,115.00 and Dennis Molengraaf for 12' plus Black Hills Spruce Trees including transplanting \$752.00; Commissioner Gabel made a substitute motion, second by Schweer, to purchase all 20 of the 12'/plus Black Hills Spruce trees from Dennis Molengraaf for \$400.00 per tree; all voted aye; motion carried.

APPROVE TRANSPLANTING TREES FOR MEMORIAL PARK
